## NATIONAL & REGIONAL NEWS

Companions Kerm Neal (Commander), Randy Helms (Colorado Springs Councilman), and Rich Peters (Junior Vice Commander) attended the 9/11 memorial with community and military leaders who gathered at Fort Carson Colorado in front of a twisted beam from the towers to remember the nearly 3,000 people who died

# on 9/11 and those killed in the Global War on Terror that followed.

Col. Buddy Ferris, 4th Infantry Division deputy commander called on the community to remember not only the tragedy, but the nation's resilience and those who answered the call to serve after the terrorist attacks. He said, "Our challenge today is to ensure we never forget those that perished, but also to remember how we responded, how we came together as a community and as a country."

# NATIONAL PROGRAM LOCAL ARTICLES HOMELAND SECURITY (HS)

Secretary Mayorkas 21 Apr 23 address to Council on Foreign Relations Highlighted Tackling an Evolving Threat Landscape. Some highlights include the following:

- To meet the threat of domestic violent extremism, we created the Center for Prevention Programs and Partnerships to share with local communities the best practice models of identification and intervention when an individual is exhibiting signs of moving towards violence.
- Through our grant programs we are helping communities build threat prevention capabilities where previously they did not exist, responding to the reality that major metropolitan areas are no longer our adversaries' only targets.
- Across the Federal Government, we are working with communities impacted by unprecedented extreme weather events to strengthen their long-term recovery.
- We have developed for the first time Departmentwide incident management teams to lead all-ofgovernment responses to emergent challenges, from vaccinating millions of Americans against COVID-19 and resettling Afghan nationals in Operation Allies Welcome, to providing protection for fleeing Ukrainians in Uniting for Ukraine.
- We are coordinating and sharing intelligence with our partner nations and executing whole of

government disruption and dismantlement campaigns to attack cartels.

 We are working collaboratively with our partners across government, at home and abroad, and with industry and academia, to manage and reduce risk to the cyber and physical infrastructure Americans rely on every day.

- Age limits for entering active-duty service are now between 17-39. Previously the cut-off for joining active-duty service was 17-23.
- The U.S. Army was in charge of exploring and mapping America. The Lewis and Clark Expedition was an all-Army affair. Army officers were the first Americans to see such landmarks as Pike's Peak and the Grand Canyon.
- The first woman to serve in the military posed as a man. In 1781, Deborah Sampson enlisted in the Army with a fake male identity. She went undetected until she sustained multiple injuries at battle and her identity was discovered. She was the only woman to earn a full military pension for participation in the Revolutionary Army.
- Military families relocate 10 times more often than civilian families. On average, military families are sent to new duty stations every 2 or 3 years.
- The U.S. Government is the largest employer of veterans. Veterans are significantly more likely than nonveterans to work for the federal government, and women veterans are the most likely of all to work for the federal government.
