NATIONAL & REGIONAL NEWS

Fort Carson, CO, 11 Sep 23

Standing near a memorial made with a remnant of the World Trade Center outside Fort Carson's

Gate 1. **Mountain Post** and community members commemorated the 22nd anniversary of the Sept. 11,



2001, terrorist attacks.

In remembrance of all those who responded to and were tragically killed on that fateful day, three wreaths were laid during the ceremony. The wreaths are in honor of the lives lost at the World Trade Center in New York City; the Pentagon in Arlington, Virginia; and in the field near Shanksville, Pennsylvania. In all, nearly 3,000 lives were lost in the attacks.

Retired Air Force Gen. John Hyten, former vice chairman to the Joint Chiefs of Staff stated "Sadly, we live in a world today where terrorism still exists. We must continue to be vigilant against that threat. Our job is to deter that threat from

attacking our country. But we have to be ready to respond if attacks do occur," Hyten said "We live in a very dangerous world right now, significant threat to our nation. ... I remain confident in our national security, primarily because men and women of this country proudly wear the cloth of our nation and swear it is important to defend our Constitution against all enemies. When called upon, I know you will answer the call."

Representing the Chapter at this solemn ceremony were Chapter Commander Kerm Neal; Companion and Colorado Springs City Councilman Randy Helms; and Junior Vice Commander Rich Peters.
