Mike Mcgrath's Bio:

MIKE MCGRATH, Captain, USN, Retired. A Colorado native from Delta, CO, Mike attended the University of Colorado one year

before entering the Naval Academy. He completed flight training and was designated a Naval Aviator. Flying off the aircraft carrier, USS Ranger, he flew 157 missions over Southeast Asia. Later, in 1967, flying off the USS Constellation 22 combat missions, he was shot down and taken as a prisoner of war where he was held captive for six years. Suffering extreme mental and physical cruelties, Mike resisted these brutalities and was released in 1973. He has held numerous positions in the military since then and upon retirement flew for United Airlines. Mike was inducted into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2003, and he has been presented with the Medal of Courage for good reason.

The MOWW Colorado Springs Chapter participated in the Colorado Springs Police Department (CSPD) Annual Medal of Valor Dinner held on 26 September 2025.
