Title: COS MOWW and RMYLF Recognized by Colorado Springs City Council

The Colorado Springs Chapter and the Rocky Mountain Youth Leadership Foundation, the Patriotic Education Program of the Chapter, were officially recognized by the City of Colorado Springs for their dedication to the community in a City Council session held on April 8th. An official proclamation was read in the City Council chambers by Colorado Springs Mayor Yemi Mobolade and Council President, and fellow MOWW Companion, Randy Helms giving the history of MOWW, and the impact on the youth of Colorado Springs and the enrichment provided to the entire community. Proclamation

MILITARY ORDER OF THE WORLD WARS COLORADO SPRINGS CHAPTER 151 AND THE ROCKY MOUNTAIN YOUTH LEADERSHIP FOUNDATION

APRIL 2025

- WHEREAS,** the Military Order of the World Wars was first recognized as a Veteran Service Organization by Congress in 1919. The "Great War" was over, and US military officers were returning home. Their Commander-in-Chief, General John J. Pershing, counseled his wartime leaders, "...May I ask that you carry home your high ideals and continue to live as you have served." Many veteran officers sought to fulfill that request, forming their own order to serve their communities and maintain the fraternal bonds forged on the battlefield; and
- WHEREAS,** this veteran organization is unique in service primarily to the community from which they reside; and
- WHEREAS,** their seven pillars include: Support to the University of Colorado, Colorado Springs Reserve Officer Training Program and various high school Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps Programs; Recognition of local Scouts and Scouting programs; Support to Public Safety & Law and Order through recognition of the achievement of local responders; Support to Veterans Affairs programs; Support to Homeland Security programs; and Support to National Security programs; and
- WHEREAS,** their 35 years of sponsorship for a Patriotic Education Program through the Rocky Mountain Youth Leadership Foundation and annual hosting of the nationally recognized Rocky Mountain Youth Leadership Conference whose five-day, in-residence, college-like experience has provided a fully funded education in leadership, patriotism, and the free-enterprise system for rising high school seniors; and
- WHEREAS,** the contributions of the Colorado Springs 90 members, past and present, have enriched our community and helped shape the youth of our city; and
- WHEREAS,** we recognize the contributions of the ninety Companions who comprise the local Chapter for living their motto "It is nobler to serve than to be served."




